


## Larry Jansen Stops Bevos, 2-1, for 30th Hill Victory

San Francisco Seals pitcher Larry Jansen becomes the last Pacific Coast League pitcher to win 30 games when he fashions a 2-1 complete game victory over Portland before 4,204 in Lucky Beavers Stadium.

Pitching only 11 miles from his home in Forest Grove, Washington, Jansen notches his 31st complete game of the season, allowing the seventh-place Beavers only four hits, while striking out seven and not walking a batter.

A two-time National League All-Star, Jansen pitches eight seasons for the New York Giants and one season with Cincinnati, compiling a 122-89 record with a 3.58 ERA.

With the win, San Francisco (112-67) remains two games in front of the Oakland Oaks (110-69) with three games left to play in the regular season ... Lefty O'Doul's Seals eventually capture their first PCL pennant since 1935, finishing 115-68 and four games ahead of the second-place Oaks (111-72).
