

Highlighted by an eight-run ninth inning and aided by 15 Thomasville errors, the Lexington Indians move to 2-0 on the season beating the bumbling Tommies 15-5 before 2,100 cold and disgruntled fans at Finch Field in a North Carolina State (D) League game.

Shortstop Henry Corriggio (6 errors) and 20-year-old center fielder Lou Mostow (5 errors) are the primary culprits behind Thomasville mound ace Joe Lindsay ... Lindsay aids in the debacle allowing 11 hits, walking one and hitting a batter in eight innings of work.

Corriggio plays 11 games for the Tommies before being optioned to the Mount Airy Graniteers of the Bi-State (D) League ... the 23-year-old rookie blossoms into an outstanding hitter for Andy Griffith's hometown team (.315 batting average, 14 home runs), but will continue to struggle in the field making 24 errors in 59 games at third base.

Mostow makes eight errors in 13 games and is hitting a less-than-robust .189 for Thomasville before being released on May 24 ... labeled a "speed merchant" by the *Richmond Times Dispatch*, Mostow will play two years (1941-1942) in the minors.

Born Ray Walter Lindsay on December 5, 1907, the World War II veteran wins 154 games over 11 minor league seasons, including eight at the D level ... a three-time 20-game winner and four-time all-star, the Sevierville, Tennessee native strikes out 1,904 batters in 2,133 career innings ... following his playing career, Lindsay is hired by the Catawba County Prison Camp to work principally with youthful offenders.

Duke's freshman team pounds out a season-high 18 hits en route to a 17-7 win over the frosh team from nearby Wake Forest College ... Washington & Lee's John Ligon strikes out 16 as the Generals beat Davidson 6-0 in a Southern Conference game ... the Knoxville Smokies of the Southern Association sign former major league pitcher Harry Smythe; Smythe, 5-12 in three major league seasons - Philadelphia Phillies (1929-1930), New York Yankees (1934) and the Brooklyn Dodgers (1934) - proves to be a good addition finishing 14-9 with a 4.52 ERA ... third baseman Grey Clarke drives in seven runs with a single, double and a triple as the Dallas Rebels open a 14-game homestand with a 12-5 win over the visiting Houston Buffaloes ... the Borger Gassers, behind the four-hit pitching of lefty Bill Garland, beat the Big Spring Bombers 4-2; the 21-year-old Garland will finish 18-5 with a 2.84 ERA.
