## On This Date September 3, 1922

After losing 27 straight games and establishing an unofficial record for consecutive defeats, the Paducah Indians, behind a six-hitter by Frank "Lefty" Semands, surprise the home fans by beating the visiting Paris Travelers 4-1 at League Park on the final Sunday of the 1922 season.

A native of Louisville, the 17-year-old Semands, working on two days of rest after surrendering 19 hits in an 9-5 loss to Trenton on Thursday, is "in top form," striking out eight and walking only one Parisian.

Paducah's last win was back on August 4, and following a doubleheader loss to the Travelers the following day, the Indians will end the second half of the Kitty League season with an 8-50 record. Overall, Paducah (which went through four managers during the course of the season) finishes 39-73, that includes a respectable 31-23 first-half mark.

Semands, who is credited with two of the Indians' eight second-half wins, signs with the American Assocation's Louisville Colonels on November 2.
