In a Pacific Coast League game in Los Angeles' Washington Park, Los Angeles Angels' right-hander **Doc Crandall** has his bid for a no-hitter ruined when his brother Karl, playing for the visiting Salt Lake Bees, proves that "blood is not thicker than water" when he drills a single with two outs in the top of the ninth inning.

Doc Crandall finishes the warshortened season with a 16-9 mark and a 2.06 ERA, while his brother Karl hits .272 in an injuryplagued season.

When the PCL season ends in July, the 30-year-old Crandall gets into five games with the National League's Boston Braves in his final major-league tour.

The Wadena, Indiana, native fashions a 224-147 career minor league record, including five 20-win seasons over 15 seasons. In 10 major league seasons, the 5-foot-10 180-pound right-hander is 102-62 with 25 saves and a 2.92 ERA. In 1910, with the New York Giants he is 17-4 with 13 complete games and a 2.56 ERA.

A charter member of the Pacific Coast League Hall of Fame, Crandall throws the first pitch from the mound when Los Angeles' Wrigley Field in 1925.
