Sacramento Cordovas' Fred Brown pitches a 10-inning perfect game, facing only 30 batters, in a 1-0 win over the visiting Stockton Millers in a California State League game at the Cordovas' Oak Park Recreation Grounds.

In a game that takes only one hour and 25 minutes to play, the lone run is tal-



lied in the bottom of the tenth inning when Sacramento catcher Hennie Iverson reaches third base on a throwing error by second baseman Campbell and then has a successful steal of home when Millers catcher Conrad drops the ball,

Stockton's William "Doc" Moskiman, an ex-medical student, is the hard luck-loser allowing only the unearned run on five hits. Brown, a 21-game winner in the Pacific Coast League two years earlier, will finish the 1907 season with a 24-6 mark, accounting for 63 percent of the Cordovas' 38 wins.
