Chicago White Sox pitcher **Ed** Walsh becomes the second, and last, pitcher in the 20th century to win 40 games in a season when the he pitches a four-hit 6-1 complete game victory over the visiting Detroit Tigers.



The 27-year-old right-hander from Plains, Pennsylvania, allows only four hits and strikes out nine in securing his 40th win of the year on the second-tolast day of the season.

The win moves Chicago to within a half-a-game behind the front running

Tigers with one game left to play. Detroit rebounds the following day clinching their second-straight American League title with a 7-0 win.

The only other pitcher to win 40-or-more games in a season since 1900 is New York Highlander Jack Chesbro with 41 victories in 1904.

The 27-year-old Walsh also leads the AL in starts (49), complete games (42), shutouts (11), strikeouts (269), and innings pitched (464). Walsh wins 195 games and posts a sterling 1.82 career ERA in 14 major league seasons with the White Sox (1904-1916) and Boston Braves (1917).
