Allentown rookie pitcher Johnny DeShong hurls 10 innings of no-hit ball against the Norfolk Tars and is credited with a win in his first and only career victory a 15-inning 3-2 win in the second game of a Eastern (A) League doubleheader

The youthful lefty pitches hitless ball until the 10th inning when centerfielder Neil Dougherty beats out a bunt for the Tars' first hit.

Staked to a 3-0 lead in the top of the 15th inning on the strength of a three-run double by Buffaloes' catcher Johnny Pasek, DeShong is

The game is saved when Allentown's 38-year-old player/manager Bullet Joe Bush (a 196-game winner in 17 major league seasons) throws out Norfolk right fielder Carr

Smith at home "by inches".

In out-dueling Tars right-hander and another former major leaguer Ken (Broadway) Jones, DeShong's final line reads two runs allowed on seven hits, eight walks and one strikeout in 14 1/3 innings. DeShong is released by Bush on August 23 in a general house cleaning. The following March, DeShong is named the head baseball coach at Beckley Business College in Harrisonburg.
